Dreams can come true from Aussie Champion to 2018 World Cup Winner

Corie Hodges (formerly of Warialda and Barraba NSW) has just represented Australia in her first Oztag World Cup. The World Cup comes around every 3 years, Corie was lucky enough to play in the Nationals 2017, taking out the gold medal making her a National Champion. This was where she was then selected to play for Australia.

The top 20 in Australia played the World Cup in Coffs Harbour on 2nd, 3rd and 4th November 2018. The over 27 year old Ladies Aussie Team went undefeated all weekend, scoring 72 tries with only 2 tries scored against them in the 6 round games. This then took them to the semi final winning 12-0 and taking out the World Champions 9-0 in the Grand final. Corie is now one of the top 20 in the

world to represent Australia in the Seniors women division.

Corie is the daughter or Wendy and the late Paul Hodges. Her brother, Mick, nieces Ruby and Evelyn and members of the Hodges, Blackford and Densley Families are very proud supporters.

Corie states "this has been a long time coming and I can now tick it off my bucket list. Many people out there would love to be in my position right now and I totally encourage them to strive for their goals. It is totally worth every bit of hard work and my only advice is to never give up, the feeling is sensational and I hope to be back next year."

Teacher – Level 0

Intervention 1

In class Refer to Level 0 behaviours

Intervention 2

in class Refer to Level 0 behaviours

Intervention 3

- 1 Send student out of class to Head Teacher or Buddy Teacher.
- 2 Student to complete a reflection sheet. (If a detention is required, then the teacher must follow up to ensure they attend & complete a reflection sheet).
- 3 Teacher to enforce consequences & resolutions as per the reflection sheet. Staff may choose to contact home.
- 4 Student misbehaviours within the next few lessons....

Head Teacher – Level 1


Head Teacher:

- contacts home (leave message emails Level 1 letter if contactable)
- seeks out student to resolve the behaviours at an appropriate time and completed a Class Contract with the student and teacher.
- Request student hand in phone until days end and keep in a secure location
- Instigates a conversation between the student and Year Advisor
- Resolve further concerns while on Level 1 once.

Level 1 also immediately applies for all Level 1 behaviours.

Second negative behaviour during the Level 1 five day monitoring cycle

Deputy Principal – Level 2




- Contacts home (leave message emails Level 2 letter if contactable)
- Requests student hand in phone until days end and keep in a secure location
- makes one attempt to resolve concerns with the student while on Level 2.

Level 2 also immediately applies for all Level 2 behaviours.

Second negative behaviour during the Level 2 five day monitoring cycle



Time-with support—Level 3



- Students on Level 3 must not have a phone at school.
- Level 3 also applies for all Level 3 behaviours.
- Student returns to Level 2 monitoring after Level 3 is completed.

Failure for student to comply with **all** supervising staff requirements to complete work and remain where requested until

Time-with support is complete.
